- Mayor Smith informed the audience of the Silverton Art and Wine Festival which will take place on Saturday, July 21st from 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. at Meier's Winery. Come and enjoy the art displays, wine and food!
- Silverton Summer Concert Series The series continues on Friday, July 20, 2007 at 7 p.m. with Sound Body Jazz Orchestra. Mrs. Glover asked if mainly Silverton residents attend the concerts or do we draw an audience from other communities. Mr. Wendling reported that we have a good mix of both Silverton residents and residents of other communities.

NEW BUSINESS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. Clerk of Court Report

Mrs. George gave the Mayor's Court Report for June 2007. Mr. Sylvester motioned to approve the Mayor's Court Report and was seconded by Mr. Quarry. All voted aye. Motion carried.

2. Budget Report

Mr. Wendling reported Mr. Peterson was on vacation and would give the June and July budget reports at the August meeting.

3. City Manager's Report

Mayor Smith turned the meeting over to Mr. Wendling to present his report.

3.1. CRA/TIF Update

Mr. Wendling reported that Mr. Citron has done a great job on getting the Community Reinvestment Area program setup. The four areas being targeted are:

- 1. The Fordhams (the Fordhams, the Cedarwoods, Lillian and Walker)
- 2. The Hamptons (Hampton & Aldon)
- 3. Siebern, Belkenton, Grace, Placid, Park & Kenton
- 4. Haines Cresap (Parkview, St. James, Grand, Alpine, Elm, Oak & Highland)

The CRA is designed to spur reinvestment in neighborhoods showing signs of distress through tax abatements on improved values. Mr. Wendling hopes to have the document drafted and ready for passage at the September meeting. Mr. Citron has also been working on a Tax Increment Financing district as an overlay of the City Central business district and the Montgomery Road corridor. Mr. Wendling will have more details at the August workshop.

3.2. Comprehensive Plan

Mr. Wendling reported that the Steering Committee is making great progress. The current focus of the group is the City Central area. They will begin looking at the wider city in the next few months. The committee is on target to finish by the end of the year.

3.3. Silverton School Project

Mr. Wendling reported that the school project is moving forward and he has received a preliminary site plan. Mr. Wendling will present the site plan to Council at the August workshop and would like someone from CPS at the meeting to address any questions.
