RESOLUTION NO. 22-853

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING 2022 POLICY PRIORITIES FOR THE VILLAGE OF SILVERTON

WHEREAS, Mayor Smith and Village Council met on March 5, 2022 to discuss policy objectives for the 2022 fiscal year and beyond; and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to express and affirm its strategic priorities for 2022 for the Village.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Council of the Village of Silverton, Ohio, that:

SECTION I.

The Village Council hereby adopts the following policy priorities for 2022:

- Maintain operating reserves and debt service fund reserves to be in full compliance with Council policies, and determine if additional reserves should be set aside to prepare for economic uncertainty,
- Create jobs in our community to grow our tax base and provide opportunity for residents by attracting new businesses and helping existing businesses thrive and expand,
- Improve roads and establish additional public parking in the central business district,
- Improve property maintenance enforcement to ensure all properties at least meet minimum community standards,
- Improve Silverton's public facilities, including our parks and government buildings, and determine if it is feasible to establish community multipurpose space in partnership with Silverton Elementary, and
- Promote the Village and engage residents through public information and programming.

SECTION II.

The Village Manager is hereby authorized and directed to work on these goals and periodically report back to the Mayor and Council on progress towards each one.

SECTION III.

This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowable by law.
